It was good to have Todd Mounfort bringing us up to date on Koroipita. I could sense the enthusiasm rising and expect that next year, if he needs a team out there, that a good group will join me for the trip.

It's important to keep in touch. My challenge is to inspire all five Rotary Clubs to collaborate with each other as much as possible. Isolation is not a helpful characteristic for Rotary. The more voices we have the better, provided they speak with a united front. Each Club has its own character and, like a mosaic, can be part of a total picture, making more sense if all fit together with one overall purpose.

At the same time we need to look at the strengths in our own Club (or the lack of them) and find out how to protect ourselves from a downhill slide. I liked Margriet's talk about being an interpreter. We listen to those about us who are crying out in a language that describes their challenges. Are we able to understand their needs enough to convert their heart cry into appropriate answers to those needs?

We have many talents between us that are available to use. I have sensed, since becoming President, that many are eager to get busy and make Rotary more than a meal, with the usual trappings of a weekly meeting. Let's keep inspiring each other.

Dr Wallace Bain will present next week a challenge that impacts our community with a lot of sadness. Come with your Rotarian heart. Behind every challenge is an opportunity to make a difference.

Club speaker: Margriet Theron

A few years ago Margriet attended the first session of a 12-week interpreting course being taught for the Rotorua Multicultural Council at Community House, just to welcome (as Vice-President of the Rotorua Multicultural Council) the tutors who had come from Decypher in Hamilton to teach the course. She found it so interesting that she completed the course and is now an accredited Afrikaans/English interpreter and translator, employed on an as-required basis by Decypher.

Some of the main clients for interpreting services are hospitals, the Police, schools, the Courts and Immigration NZ. Margriet translates wills, purchase agreements and school reports from Afrikaans into English. Recently she went to Gisborne twice to interpret for an accused at the District Court.

Guest speaker: Todd Mountfort

The Model Towns Charitable Trust of Fiji has as its slogan: "Building homes, rebuilding lives". Todd has been the Volunteer Site Supervisor during Rotary home building projects at Koroipita, having gone on his first trip there in 2009. He has huge admiration for the work that Rotarian Peter Drysdale has done for the Fijian community. Peter can communicate in any of the 27 dialects spoken in Fiji. When members of the Rotary Club of Rotorua went to Fiji in 2014 they undertook a family recovery project, moving them from a shack to a newly built house. Todd is delighted that the houses built by Rotary withstood the destruction caused to the rest of the island by Cyclone Winstone of February 2016, with wind gusts of up to 300 kph. There is a Fiji Rebuild Fund which provides \$7,000 to residents who have lost their homes. Todd's impression is that the squatter villages are looking worse than in the past. He is proud of the sewerage treatment plant built for \$630,000 by Rotary, enabling the remainder of the budget of \$1.2 million to be returned for use in other projects. Some houses built by Habitat for Humanity were left with no kitchen and no floor; Peter Drysdale's team has stepped in to finish these homes. He is impressed by the multi-purpose bus stop built by Rotary which also serves as a social gathering place and a produce market. Some toilets, showers and kitchens are being rebuilt because they were not up to New Zealand Foreign Aid standards. Gardens are growing well around the house built by our Club. It houses a single mother, her five children and her parents. Todd was very excited when he was able to show his parents around Koroipita. The Te Puke Rotary Club is working in income generating programmes in Fiji, including a bee keeping business.
