

Yet both Juleen and I not only have to pull the reins in more than a bit, but we need to get some advice on how best to plan our future. There's a lot of help out there, so long as it doesn't destroy the vision that makes us who we are.

As a Rotarian I guess I am part of the older set who enjoy the fellowship and not so much the active involvement. But don't get me wrong! I'm still in it as much as I can be. Only I must appreciate the need to step back and let younger hands carry the load. We older members will still do what we can, and also to mentor and encourage.

Mark is the first non-sworn officer to receive this award. He has made a major contribution to the Cactus programme at the local secondary schools. On his request, his cash award of \$250 has been donated to the Rotorua SPCA.

Guest speaker Reade Nikora

Reade was Deputy Head Boy at Western Heights High School in 2014. He has been the leader of the Rotorua Youth Council and now works at the Rotorua Lakes Council as Road Safety Coordinator. He is closely involved in the Rotorua Road Safety Youth Expo. Youth between 20 and 24 years of age are at the highest risk of being involved in serious traffic accidents. The target of the Road Safety Youth Expo is to improve the behaviour of young drivers and to develop a responsible citizens' approach to driving. About 1,800 students mostly from Year 11 attend the Expo. Rotarians Tony Baker, Ray Oakley and Garth Wilson play an active part in running the Expo. Information is handed out to the participants as interactive documents on USB memory sticks. Rotary, the Rotorua and Taupo District Councils and the Police collaborate in running the Driver Directions day for students at the Taupo race track.
