# FROM PREVIOUS MEETING

#### **Guest Speaker, Mark Gibb**

Mark started his talk by saying that he had originally come from Rotorua as his parents moved here in the mid 1970's. He is a keen fly fisherman. Prior to becoming the CEO of Rotorua Airport in 2016 he

was in general management at Fonterra and had experience working at Auckland Airport. He reported that the Rotorua Airport had an asset value of \$46 million. The Council is now owes \$3.6 million and they hope to pay that off within the next 10 12 years. He is focussed on growth strategies particularly into Christchurch, Auckland and Wellington but also looking outside NZ for strong growth. The airport has 105 hectares of land, 70 of which could be developed. Management is looking at three areas in which to grow the airport: flight school aviation, general aviation and commerce/tourism. There is a need to develop better facilities. The existing fire station is to be demolished and replaced at a cost of \$1.3 million and changes will be made to the current terminal with a total refurbishment. There will also be an increase in aviation security which means employment for 26-30 people. Air NZ is looking at the feasibility of a Koru lounge and rental car companies will have new booths. Overall, an interesting and factual speech.

# Club Speaker, Katrina Allison

Katrina spoke about a contract she held with the DHB. It involved completing assessments for those youth who identified as transgender. Over a three year period she saw approximately 36 youth who were required to be assessed before medical transition.
