Guest Speaker – Peter Spurdle

Fergus Cumming introduced Peter as our guest speaker. Peter spoke of a recent trip abroad which covered Bosnia & Herzegovina, Croatia and England

Peter started at their first stop in Saravejo and painted a picture of the city of around 275,000 and its position before elaborating on the civil war and the religious instances leading up to it. The seige of the city was the longest ever recorded of 1425 days.

The area loosly descibred as Yugoslavia has been subject to religious conflicts for centuries and invasions from other countries.

Moving on to England Peter spoke of his and Robyn's 12 days on the Thames Path which follows the river Thames from its source into London. They walked at a fairly leisurely pace stopping overnight in various spots which seemed to be either in, or close to, a pub! Peter showed a video of the walk taken with his phone which showed preciisely the route over what he descibed as fairly level ground.
