Guest Speaker – Fred Shilton

Murray introduced Fred who spoke of the establishment of the new roundabout in the Hemo Gorge at the intersection of 2 State Highways. Fred works as an engineer for Opus, an offshoot of the Ministry of Works, which has recently been bought out by a Canadian company and is now world-wide.

The project started on the premise of 12,500 vehicles using that intersection daily and the relatively large number of incidents that occurred. (Near Misses and Risks) The project was beset with conditions that couldn't have been foreseen so had to be countered on the way through. The most interesting being the uncovering of settling tanks for Rotorua's first water supply in the late 1800's. A project taking longer than expected due to the pitfalls.
