#### **Guest Speaker - Tim Charleson**

**Russell Dale** introduced Tim who has spent 17 years working with Red Stag Timber at the Waipa Mill.

The mill was built in 1939 to process the exotic timber growing in the locality and is now the largest in the Southern Hemisphere, currently employing 300 staff ad 50 contractors.

In 2003 it was purchased by the Verry family and has developed into providing sawn timber for the NZ market extensively.

In 2016 the mill was practically rebuilt using the latest technology of reading the logs to get the greatest benefit from the milling,

treatment and transportation, coping with 70-80 loads of logs a day. The mill is basically self-sufficient using bark and offcuts to produce its power requirements.
