Last Meeting - 02 March 2020

Murray had leave to attend a family funeral, so Martin Kinder became our chair for the day. Martin welcomed members and guest speaker Jonothan Hagger and visitor, Sue Werry. He also mentioned the School Leaders lunch, planned for 16 March, and the District Conference on 22-24 May in Rotorua.

Ann introduced Jonothan Hagger, the DEO of Hospice Rotorua who has been in that position for 18 months, overseeing the shift to Hinemoa Street. Jonothan described what palliative care is and advised that currently 50% of their patients are non-cancer patients, mainly dementia patient. The staff complete around 10,000 visits a year to patients in their environments, either at home or in residential care. This care covers a 24-hour period seven days a week and is funded 50% by the DHB and 50% by community funding.

For the future the Trust is looking at increased specialisation and this includes supporting a nurse to gain nurse practitioner status.
